## FROM THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO – LUKE–:

*“After they had completed [the days of the feast], as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it... After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions.” (Luke 2:43, 46)<sup>1</sup>*

## MEDITATION ON THE MYSTERY:

Lord, give us the grace to help those who have lost You, who have lost the meaning of their lives, search for You again: like the prodigal son, who “was lost” when he was outside the house of the Father (that is, outside the Church – cf. 1Tim 3:15) and was “found” when he returned to the house of the father through the embrace of forgiveness (cf. Luke 15:20-24).
