

“The Wedding of Cana”...

FROM THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO - JOHN -:

“Jesus told [the servants], ‘Fill the jars with water.’ So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, ‘Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter.’ ...And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from (although the servers who had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, ‘...you have kept the good wine until now.’” (John 2:7-10)¹
